Petit Jean SP mirrors the mountain' s rugged beauty with its rustic-style, native log and stone facilities constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) beginning in 1933. The CCC built trails, roads, bridges, cabins, and the focal point of the park, historic Mather Lodge, a 24-room lodge overlooking Cedar Creek Canyon with a restaurant, meeting rooms, and gift shop. There are eight hiking trails, which includes a 1.75 mile bike trail. The Cedar Falls trail follows Cedar Creek to 95-foot Cedar Falls, one of the tallest continuously flowing waterfalls in the state.  BOOK EARLY, Campsites are reserved months in advanced. And don't forget to mention that you are an Arkansas Senior Resident, if you qualify of course.
